TOWN OF CANAJOHARIE MONTGOMERY COUNTY

June 12, 2014

The Town Council met for a regular monthly meeting at the Town Hall building, 12 Mitchell Street, Canajoharie, New York.

Present: Supervisor Herbert Allen, Councilpersons Judith Burgess, John Toomey, Jr., Rodney Young, and WilliamArmitstead; Bookkeeper Amy Kretser; Highway Superintendent David Hodge; Planning Board Chairman William Douglass; County Legislator Roy Dimond

The meeting was opened by the Supervisor at 7:30, and the evening's agenda was presented

On a motion by Councilperson Burgess, seconded by Councilman Armitstead, the **agenda** was **unanimously approved**.

On a motion by Councilman Toomey, seconded by Councilperson Burgess, the **minutes** of the April meeting were **unanimously approved**.

Public Comment-Mohawk Valley Collective representative, **Robert Smith**, speaks to Board requesting Town support for the MVC grant application to the NYS Economic Development agency—Board approves and Supervisor Allen signs letter of support.

Legislator Roy Dimond speaks regarding appointment of Town Attorney---hoping to have a decision Monday, June 16th. Informs the Board regarding the County's action(s) on puppy mills and the moratorium placed on puppy mills. The County has created a response team that will look at the issues/concerns, and the committee will also create legislation regarding puppy mills. The County is hoping to place a county-wide moratorium for all the towns.

Mr. Dimond also informs the Board that the County took over MOSA.

Planning Board Chairman William Douglass gives the Board update to the proposed auction site on Dygert Road. The owner is working on a sketch plan; Mr. Douglass wrote an outline for the auctioneer to follow. Mr. Douglass presented the outline also to the Planning Board— Planning Board concerned about proposed engineer costs, approximately \$30,000.00. Mr. Douglass concerned that the parking lot for the auction will use 40% of the 3.8 acres. He consulted a former planning board chairman, who suggested a possible 6 month moratorium. Mr. Douglass presented the Board with a draft moratorium with information he received from Ken Rose, but also indicated a lawyer would have to review it.

Supervisor Allen informed the Board that he passed along information to Mr. Douglass regarding Zoning and Planning Law Schools. The cost is \$80.00 plus mileage. Councilperson Burgess **moves** to send Mr. Douglass to the school, **seconded** by Councilman Armitstead, **unanimously approved.**

RESOLUTION #11 of 2014 OVERRIDING STATE 2% TAX CAP IMPOSED ON TOWN

Resolution by Councilman Rodney Young Seconded by: Councilman John Toomey

WHEREAS, the New York State Assembly and Senate each passed a bill that imposed a 2% tax cap on the levy of municipalities and school districts, and

WHEREAS, Governor Cuomo signed this 2% tax cap into law on June 30, 2011, and

WHEREAS, it may not be possible for the Town to stay within the constraints of this imposed tax cap and still offer valuable services to the people of the Town, and

WHEREAS, included in the said 2% tax cap law is language that authorizes the Town, by the affirmative vote of at least 60% of the Council, to override the said cap, and

WHEREAS, the Town will publish a legal notice and hold a public hearing on July 10, 2014 at 7:30pm to hear the public, for or against Local Law #2 for 2014,, which will override the 2% tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law 3-c,

RESOLVED, that the Canajoharie Town Council hereby exercises their authority and overrides the State imposed 2% tax cap on the levy in order to fund valuable services to the people of the Town.
