The meeting was opened by the Supervisor at 7:30pm, and the evening's agenda was presented

Supervisor Vroman- Presented to the Board the Town of Minden's proposed resolution setting fees for solar facilities in the Town of Minden; Minden is proposing a fee of \$250.00 per acre for each acre of a commercial solar project in their town, also including any engineering and legal fees incurred by the town during the project

-Board discusses different fee scenarios that could be implemented for our Town

PUBLIC COMMENT- Joe Greene from the Mohawk Solar project gives an overview as to where the project is; The company is attempting to abide by the 200ft setback wherever they can; Approximately 550 project acres located in the Town of Canajoharie

-explains that the company will be applying for Town building permits, variances soon; The company wants to do this before they apply to the State for their permit so there will be a complete package

-explains the 15 year PILOT program needs to be agreed to by all 5 taxing bodies [County, both Towns, both School Districts];

-Mr. Greene is under the impression that the Town of Canajoharie was approached by the County regarding the proposed PILOT program; the Town of Canajoharie has not been informed of the proposed PILOT program by the County

SUPERVISOR- continues discussion re: possible commercial solar building permit fees. The Board

discusses the following options: flat fee per parcel; \$250.00 or lower amount per acre for each acre of the project; set a fee based upon the parcel size; set a fee based upon the total size of the solar project

-Town Clerk reminds the Board that not only building permit fees should be imposed, but also special use permits for commercial solar projects, and commercial solar variance fees need to be looked at and imposed

-discussion tabled until special meeting

Motion to schedule budget workshop for September 27, 2018 at 7:30pm by Supervisor Vroman, seconded by Councilman Peruzzi, all in favor, ayes, carried

Supervisor Vroman received information from County Real Property that the Town's aged exemption law needs to be updated; Table until next regular meeting

-Supervisor Vroman also informs the Board that only 3 property owners in the Town of Minden, and 7 property owners in the City of Amsterdam are given disabled exemptions; Table until next regular meeting

Supervisor Vroman reminds the Board there are still openings on the Planning Board and ZBA; Supervisor Vroman has contacted Thomas Price if he would still be willing to serve on the BAR, waiting to hear back from Mr. Price

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT- two trucks ordered back in winter have finally arrived at the stalls and are getting their plows and dumps; Trade-in amount offered by Main Motor Cars total of \$53,000.00 [2017 Ram 2500 pick-up \$25,000.00 and Ram 5500 dump \$28,000.00];

-Motion to put the two used trucks on Auction International by Councilman Armitstead, seconded by Councilman Toomey, all in favor, ayes, carried

Superintendent Jones further reports that they're hauling in sand; Also, had meeting with Barton & Loguidice to study the town barn;

Councilmen Young and Armitstead requests that Superintendent Jones inspect a used grader that is going up for sale in Starkville
