Public Comment – No public in attendance

7:45 PM - Enter Regular Monthly meeting

Mr. Vroman discussed an email from Stephen B. Le Fevre, Senior Managing Hydrogeologist with Barton & Loguidice. Mohawk Solar has requested the towns of Canajoharie and Minden provide input regarding days of the week and corresponding hours that construction activities can occur. It was noted that typical hours of construction are, on weekdays, from 7:00 AM - 7:00 PM and on Saturdays, from 8:00 AM - 8:00 PM. It is recommended that there be no construction on Sundays or Holidays. The Councilpersons in attendance were in agreement that the proposed hours are acceptable. Mr. Vroman has reached out to the Supervisor of Minden to discuss mirroring the same hours of construction as has been proposed. Public Comment – Following the discussion regarding construction hours, Scott McDonald entered the meeting to discuss the Mohawk Solar project. Mr. Young asked what the timeframe was for the Town receiving a check for the Building Permit fees. Mr. McDonald noted it was about 1 year off – just prior to groundbreaking.

Mr. McDonald then noted that the application process has been deemed complete, allowing the next phase of the project to begin. He stated that on January 15th there will be a public meeting at the Canajoharie Library, beginning at 5:00 PM, with Administrative Law Judges present. The first 45 minutes will be dedicated to presenting information and environmental studies. Then, following a 15 minute break, the meeting will be open to public comments. All town officials present were encouraged to attend as a show of support. Mr. Vroman asked what could be asked that hasn't already been addressed and Mr. McDonald noted that it is a chance to be heard on the record.

Mr. McDonald noted that, while the timeline has had some issues, the goal is still to be operational November of 2021. He stated, while the application process has been deemed complete, the approval process can take up to a year; however, with the amount of public support the project has, there is hope it will go faster. He noted there will be a meeting with interested parties on January 22nd to include the Department of Conservation and the consultant representing the town. The issue of the project taking nesting areas for birds was discussed, noting that they have to find other areas to move and will then treat those areas as 'special' – 'if we take from here, we give to there'.

Mr. Young asked Mr. McDonald why the Town has to wait until groundbreaking to receive their money when landowners have already started receiving payment. Mr. McDonald stated the money to landowners was given to secure the land. While a check has been issued for oversight of the project, Mr. Young noted that all funds have gone to pay bills incurred due to the project and that the Town has not yet made any money.

Regarding the Intervenor Fund, Ms. Kretser noted that it is almost depleted. Mr. McDonald stated it should not go below \$4000.00; therefore, he is requesting another check be issued as the last of the outstanding bills for 2019 will take the total below the \$4000.00 threshold.

Lastly, Mr. McDonald thanked the Zoning Board of Appeals, noting the information was a lot to consider and it is very much appreciated.

At 8:00 PM, Mr. McDonald left the meeting.

Mr. Vroman discussed the Budget and the necessity to move \$500 from one area to another in order to cover a salary increase.

Peter Vroman, Supervisor noted the following:

- There will be a meeting at the Canajoharie High School on January 16th regarding The Exit 29 Redevelopment Project that he will attend to see what the plans are. Bookkeeper Amy Kretser noted the Village Officials are going to see a hemp plant, as that is one of the possibilities for the project.
- Regarding the enforcement of the Town's Land Use Laws, Mr. Vroman stated we have the authority to issue violation notices and impose fines, not to exceed \$350.00, if they are broken. He will attend the next Planning Board meeting to discuss the matter of enforcement. He further noted that the position of Planning Board Chairperson, a paid position, is open and nobody has stepped forward to fill it; therefore, as Town Supervisor, he may have to name someone. This matter will also be addressed at the next meeting.
- An email from Chris Yacobucci suggested that we have the surveyor complete a Topographical study at the same time as the Boundary work is being done in an effort to save money. Mr. Vroman will get an outline map to Councilperson Young, who will then talk to the surveyor.

Tim Jones, Highway Superintendent stated everything is business as usual in his department. Mr. Young asked what the Mohawk Solar Project construction will do to Town roads, as they have deemed some as substandard.

Christina Jewell, Town Clerk stated that, as of close of business January 9th, the Town had collected \$242,447.89 in Taxes.

Amy Kretser, Bookkeeper said money is coming in slowly and that, as of the end of the year, the general fund was only short \$132.00 plus what is owed to the Highway Department.
