- 1. The Town of Canajoharie intends to proceed with the Project, and
- 2. The Town of Canajoharie hereby determines that the project is an Unlisted action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation law and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617 and pursuant to potential funding program requirements; and
- 3. The Town Board has determined as an Unlisted action there will not be any significant environmental impacts and no further action is required, and
- 4. The Town Board hereby declares itself to be the Lead Agency for purposes of coordinated review pursuant to SEQRA; and
- 5. The Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to sign all environmental review and funding documents for the Project on their behalf.

Resolution to Approve Bonding for Town Hall

The following resolution was offered by Michael Muhlebeck, seconded by Raymond Kiefl, to wit;

BOND RESOLUTION DATED MAY 8, 2025

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE UNDERTAKING OF THE ACQUISITION OF 209 ERIE BOULEVARD IN THE TOWN OF CANAJOHARIE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY TO BE USED AS A NEW TOWN HALL, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$375,000 OF THE TOWN OF CANAJOHARIE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE SAID PURPOSE AND DELEGATING THE POWER TO ISSUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE SALE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE TOWN SUPERVISOR.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Canajoharie, Montgomery County, New York (the "Town") (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1. The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution is the acquisition of 209 Erie Boulevard, in the Town of Canajoharie, Montgomery County, New York serve as the Canajoharie Town Hall, together with the acquisition and installation of equipment, machinery and apparatus and the undertaking of necessary site work for the foregoing purpose. The maximum cost of said purpose will not exceed \$375,000.

SECTION 2. The Town Board plans to finance the maximum estimated cost of said purpose as follows: (a) by the issuance of serial bonds in an amount not to exceed \$375,000 of said Town, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law, and (b) by the application of amounts from the Town's Building Fund.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 11(c) of paragraph (a)(1) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is fifteen (15) years.

SECTION 4. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds.

SECTION 5. It is hereby determined the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years.

SECTION 6. The faith and credit of said Town are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 7. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Local Finance Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said notes and of Section 21.00, Section 23.00, Section 50.00, Sections 56.00 to 60.00, Section 62.00, Section 63.00 and Section 164.00 of the Local Finance Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of the obligations herein authorized, including but not limited to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

SECTION 8. The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this resolution. The Town then reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditure with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by Section 2 of this resolution. This resolution shall constitute the declaration of the Town's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by Section 1 hereof with the proceeds of the bonds and notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 9. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 10. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure agreement with the initial purchaser of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution, containing provisions which are satisfactory to such purchaser in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 11. The Town has previously determined that the undertaking of the acquisition of 209 Erie Boulevard, in the Town of Canajoharie, Montgomery County, New York serve as the Canajoharie Town Hall and related improvements is an unlisted action, and that it will not have a significant effect on the environment and, therefore, no other determination or procedures under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") is required. The Town has issued a "negative declaration" under SEQR in connection with such determination.

SECTION 12. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

- (1) (a) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or

(2) Said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 13. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance Law, in the official newspaper or newspapers of the Town.

SECTION 14. This resolution is adopted subject to permissive referendum pursuant to Section 35.00 of the Local Finance Law.

RESOLUTION #12 of 2025

A Resolution of the Town of Canajoharie Adopting the Montgomery County Multi-Jurisdiction Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Canajoharie recognizes the ongoing threat that natural hazards pose to people and property within the Town of Canajoharie; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Canajoharie, in collaboration with Montgomery County7 and other local jurisdictions, has participated in the preparation of a multi-hazard mitigation plan, hereby known as Montgomery County Multi-Jurisdiction Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan in accordance with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Multi-Jurisdiction Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024 identifies specific mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in from the impacts of future natural hazards and disasters within the Town of Canajoharie and surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, formal adoption of this plan demonstrates the Town of Canajoharie's commitment to hazard mitigation planning and achieving the goals outlined in the Montgomery County Multi-Jurisdiction Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Canajoharie, adopts the Montgomery County Multi-Jurisdiction Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024 as the official multi-hazard mitigation plan of the Town of Canajoharie.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that while the plan may be updated or amended as required by FEMA or state review processes, such edits shall not require re-adoption by the Town of Canajoharie unless substantial changes are made. This only applies to this specific plan and does not absolve the community from updating the plan in 5 years.
