## LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 2 OF 1982

A Local Law Establishing the Annual Salary for Certain Elective and Appointive Officers Serving for Fixed Terms

BE IT ENACTED by the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors as follows:

Section 1. (a) The annual salaries of the following County Officers are hereby fixed at the sum opposite the office and designa-tion of such County Officers to wit:

#### \$37,500 District Attorney

(b) For the Balance of the year 1983 on and after the effective date of this local law, the foregoing officers shall be paid at such a rate which, when added to amounts paid during the year 1983 prior to such effective date, will equal the annual salary fixed for such office.

such office. Section 2. This Local Law is subject to a permissive referendum, and will be submit-ted to a vote of the qualified electors of the County of Montgomery if within 45 days after the date on which it was so adopted there is filed with the Clerk of the Montgo-mery County Board of Supervisors a peti-tion protesting against this Local Law, sign-ed and authenticated as required by Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule, by quali-fied electors of the County of Montgomery registered to vote therein at last preceding general election, in number equal to at least ten per centum of the total number of votes cast for Governor at the last gubernatorial election held in said County and moves its adoption. its adoption.

Resolution Employing Alton J. Spencer, M. D. as Contractual Medical Director of the Montgomery County Infirmary

WHEREAS, Dr. Alton J. Spencer, M. D., has been employed as the Medical Director of the Montgomery County Infirmary for the past eleven years performing his duties with great skill and dedication; and

WHEREAS, for technical reasons Dr. Spencer may not be continued in this posi-tion as an employee of the County and this Board of Supervisors is desirous of contract-ing for the services of Dr. Spencer as Medi-cal Director of the Montgomery County Infirmary; now, therefore, be it and it here-by is by is

RESOLVED, that the County of Mont-gomery hereby engages the services of Dr. Spencer as Medical Director of the Montgo-mery County Infirmary for a period of one year on a contractual basis commencing on

the 27th day of November, 1982, and ending on the 26th day of November, 1983, for the sum of \$17,500.00 annually payable in twelve equal monthly installments; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Medical Director shall have the following responsibilities:

- all have the following responsibilities: To provide medical direction and coordi-nation of medical care. To develop written by-laws, rules and regulations which are approved by the governing authority and which include delineation of the responsibilities of attending physicians. To maintain liason with attending physicians to ensure that orders are written by them promptly upon admis-sion of a patient. To periodically evaluate the adequacy and appropriateness of health profession-al and supportive staff and services. To maintain surveillance of the health status of the facility's employees. To review incidents and accidents that occur on the premises in order to identi-fy hazards to health and safety. To give appropriate information to the administrator in order to insure a safe and sanitary environment for patients and personnel. To be responsible for the execution of b.

- and personnel. To be responsible for the execution of patient care policies. h.

RESOLVED, that the Medical Director shall in addition to the responsibilities set forth above perform the following duties:

- A complete medical history will be ob-tained and a complete physical examina-tion will be performed by the Medical Director within 48 hours. A tuberculin skin test will be ordered and performed, and the results read and recorded on the patient's chart at 24 and 48 hours. A T.B. Tine test may be order-ed instead of the tuberculin skin test. A chest X-ray shall be ordered before admission. admission.
- A cnest A-ray snan be ordered before admission. The Medical Director must write detail-ed, specific orders including diet, drug therapy, and special nursing care proce-dures to be followed. Consultation to the Departments of phy-sical therapy, occupational therapy, and activities should be promptly requested in writing when indicated. Each long-term nursing care patient must have a complete physical examination annually from the date of admission. The Medical Director is free to call upon the services of any Medical Specialist to assist him in the diagnosis or treatment of patients in the Infirmary. The Medical Director is required to make patient visits at least every thirty (30) days.
