Section One: No person shall throw, dump, deposit or place, or cause to be thrown, dumped, deposited or place upon the bike path, or within the limits of the right of way of such bike path, or upon private lands adjacent thereto, within the County of Montgomery, any refuse, trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or any nauseous or offensive matter.

Section Two: Nothing herein contained shall be construed as prohibiting the use in a reasonable manner of ashes, sand, salt or other material for purpose of reducing the hazard of, or providing traction on snow, ice or sleet.

Section Three: The violation of the provisions of Section One of this section shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$250.00 and/or a requirement to perform services for a public or non-profit corporation, association, institution or agency not to exceed eight hours and for any second or subsequent violation by fine not to exceed \$500.00 and/or a requirement to perform services for a public or not for profit corporation, association, institution or agency not to exceed eight hours.

Section Four: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgement, decree or order shall not effect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which the reminder of this Local Law shall remain in full force and effect.

This local law shall take effect upon its adoption and the filing of one certified copy thereof with the County Clerk and three certified copies in the Office of the Secretary of State.
