IV. Financial Impact:

In 2015 there were 61 burials with a total cost of \$122,539 and in 2016 there were 67 burials at a total cost of \$143,142. The most recent numbers for 2017 indicate that as of October, there have been 54 burials at a cost of \$110,000.

We've streamlined the new policy and there is a relatively small increase in pricing when comparred to our previous policy. The major driver of costs in future years is more the number of burials than the change in policy.
