## Supervisor Report, July 2021, as of Aug 9

- Red Cross blood drive, August 18, 9am-2pm, at the town hall
- Budget work continues, General wrapped up Aug 9, tentative budget will be available for Sept 13 meeting
- Received 2Q sales tax, \$177,841. Sales tax is up 43%, we are on track to exceed our budget revenue number by \$100K+
- Monthly court fines for July are \$56,802, on track to exceed our budget revenue number by \$50K+
- American Rescue funding received 7/22, \$84,424. The state did the town/village split. An additional \$84,424 will come to the town next year.
- SAM grant in final approval, we should see \$300,000 by year end, due to principal is \$301,000
- Snow and ice removal contract with the county, July 21, I proposed 10% increase over next three years, 5% year 1, 2.5% years 2 and 3, Matt countered with 5% increase over 2 years, 3% year 1, 2% year two
- Met with the village on July 19 to discuss the new Water and Sewer agreements
  - Both boards will approve a resolution to work together in the event of an issue that does not have a clear owner
  - Sewer rate increase by the village, 31% increase on Jan 1, 2022, going from \$9/thousand gallons to \$11.79/thousand gallons, the village passed the same increase to the village residents
  - There is no change in the water rate, it remains \$13.59, (190% of the resident's rate)
- County wide household hazardous waste collection day Aug 14
- Eden PILOTS, Tom, Larry, Russ and I met with Eden, (Giovani and Gillian) and Stella
- Cannabis, 1 more public hearing, or put it to a vote?
- Trident/Hoy inventory completed, up 8% to \$42,593, still impacted by claim history

- National Grid gas service request for Sewer One genset
- 5:30pm, Budget workshop Sept 13, final draft review, public hearing Oct 11, 6:30pm
  No progress to report this month
- W&S truck awarded, lead time is now 6 months, Ford is currently working on their Jan build schedule, color has been changed to blue at no additional cost
- Partial refund for our 2020 unemployment claim, \$1,208, still pending
- Water and sewer connection applications have been submitted to the village for their review and approval for the County Shared Services and Pilot Truck Stop facilities
